This one hour / one lesson course is specifically designed for easier curriculum management. The minimum booking is three hours, so for example, you could book sessions with different classes. With a maximum of five sessions in a day it should be relatively straightforward to cover an entire year group. The One-hour First Aid is also suitable as a re-fresher course

Expeditions & Adventure First Aid

Preparation for outdoor activities, expeditions and adventure activities should include preparedness training for anyone operating in outdoor environments where emergency help is close but not readily available.

This course aims to equip learners with a clear system to manage incidents (including themselves, the rest of the group and any casualties) so that they can keep calm under pressure, give emergency first aid and look after those in need until help arrives.

This innovative course is rooted from practical experience and teaches all of the basic First Aid skills. It additionally prepares learners to apply those skills within remote outdoor environments. The active course is a practical, fun and engaging way to learn skills vital for both expeditions and that are also useful in a wider variety of contexts.

Learners need to meet the following prerequisite requirements:

- Experienced or Qualified in First Aid
- Be at least 14 years of age
- Be capable of kneeling on the floor to deliver CPR
- It is advisable that learners have a minimum of level 1 in literacy and numeracy or equivalent

EFAW Option Requirements **

- This option must be pre-booked in advance
- Learners must be at least 16 years of age
